SECOND REQUEST FOR RESPONSE

Re Request for Criminal Investigation, Prosecution & VA Audit of False Rape Accuser and Former U.S. Marine Kathleen Fischer nee Konicki of Jacksonville North Carolina

On August 7, 2017, Save Our Heroes' Project sent a document package via certified U.S. Mail, requesting a criminal investigation of Ms. Kathleen Konicki, also known as Kathleen Fisher, a resident of Jacksonville, North Carolina, and a former enlisted U.S. Marine. A copy of that cover letter has been included for reference, and the request was to include an audit, investigation and prosecution of a fraudulent Veterans Administration claim for PTSD due to Military Sexual Trauma.



To reiterate, the request for a criminal investigation and audit involves the filing of false allegations of sexual assault by Konicki against a U.S. serviceman, allegations that were entirely manufactured. The serviceman was eventually cleared. The 200+ pages of documents and evidence previously supplied, explicitly reveal the brazen and ultra-aggressive manner in which Fisher-Konicki made these false claims. The evidence about how Konicki manufactured allegations of sexual assault against a serviceman in order to fraudulently obtain veterans administration benefits is stunning and justifies the need for an official criminal investigation, leading to an indictment, prosecution, and the recovery of funds that have been fraudulently obtained.

At the time of the filing of our original complaint, we respectfully asked for a letter of acknowledgment that our complaint had been received. After nearly six months, we have never received a response and to our knowledge, none of the witnesses have been contacted. It is our belief that Ms. Fisher-Konicki is still defrauding the taxpayers.

SOH fully understands the volume of cases that the FBI and the V.A. Office of Inspector General receive, however this case example is but one of which we believe is a pandemic of fraudulent VA claims for PTSD due to Military Sexual Trauma, and in this case, multiple federal crimes had been committed in the process.

On December 28, 2017, Veterans Affairs Inspector General Michael Missa was interviewed on FOX News. During this interview, IG Missa emphasized the job of the Office of Inspector General is to conduct the appropriate investigation to root out the “waste, fraud, and abuse.” Ms. Konicki’s actions are exactly what the VA IG office is empowered to do and the American people expect.

Once again, Save Our Heroes’ Project respectfully requests a letter of acknowledgment as well as the status of the investigation.
